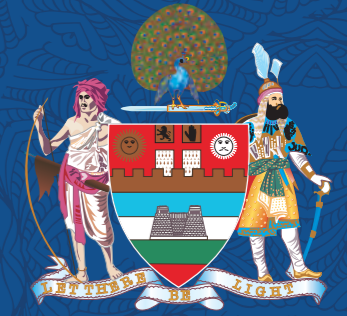

Lahore, father of the famous Rudyard Kipling.

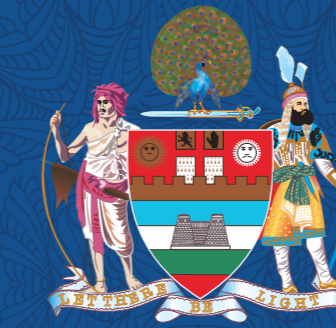
At the top of the shield are the Mayo Arms and Quarterings, a
lion rampant and an open hand, flanked by the Sun and the Moon,
both depicting the lineages of the great clans of the Rajputs: the
Suryavanshis and the Chandravanshis.

The bottom half of the shield is adorned by the Panchranga
filled with the five sacred colours of the Rajput clans: red, gold,
blue, white and green. In the middle is a Rajput Fort with two
towers joined with a curtain wall.

On the left of the shield is a Bhil warrior with a bow and a
quiver full of arrows, whereas, on the right is a Rajput gallant
armed at all points: a steel helmet with three plumes, a shield on
the back, a dagger and a katar in his cummerbund, an armour of
chain mail covered with embroidered cloth and wearing a
gauntlet on his hand.

Above the shield is a peacock, the sacred bird of Rajputana,
perched on a 'Khanda' (double-edged Rajput sword).

The art school provides classes and studio-facility to students from class VII to XII. The students of Class IV to VI have separate art rooms housed in Junior School campus. The students try their hands at different forms and mediums of painting, sculpture, pottery & ceramics, print-making, carpet weaving, recycled paper making, paper mache and other paper crafts. Apart from the general school routine, weekly hobby classes are offered to the students according to their respective choice.

The Art School organises different art workshops and camps through which the children get training from visiting artists and resource persons. The annual art exhibition is a gala event which exhibits the potential and talent of the students in their multitude and variety. In the last three years, our students have successfully applied to leading universities and colleges in 15+ countries and have been offered more than 50 scholarships.

Apart from this, the school also has a state-of-the-art laundry.

The Mayo Career Guidance Centre aims to provide every student from grade IX to XII customized one to one support for stream & subject selection, identifying areas of strength, defining preferred career paths, building desired skills and competitive portfolios and selecting 'Good Fit' colleges/ universities. Experts lectures, psychometric tests, university meets, career fairs and intensive career counseling is undertaken with students of classes IX–XII.

For our senior students the School holds preparatory classes for CLAT, PSAT; SAT and is also a center for SAT and Trinity College, London Speech, Drama and Music exams.

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

For detailed information visit school website

1. Registration: Check age eligibility & register from school website by August 31.
2. Common Aptitude Analysis: held on the 3rd Saturday of September every year at various centers in India. It assesses prospective students in subjects of English, Hindi and Math. For foreign students, waiver in Hindi may be considered. The test can also be arranged overseas through the Indian Embassy /School in which the boy is studying.
3. Interaction: Candidates who clear the written test will be called for an interaction.
4. Selected candidates will be informed by e-mail.
5. New students join School in April each year.

1. Address for communication must be written clearly. Any change in contact details must be intimated to the Principal. All information regarding the Aptitude Analysis will be sent to the latest details registered with the college. Last date to apply is 31 Aug. The assessment will be based on three subjects English, Mathematics and Hindi.
2. The Aptitude Analysis will be held on the 3rd Sat of Sept every year.
3. Any request regarding change in date of birth shall not be entertained.
4. Eligibility: At the time of Aptitude Analysis, for a particular class, the boy must be studying in:-
 - (i) One Class Lower.
 - (ii) He must strictly meet the age requirements.
5. Permission to sit in the Aptitude Analysis may be withheld if the boy is not eligible as para 4 above or para 6 below.
