Again a happy and splendid academic session comes to its end leaving unforgettable charming memories for the rockies of Ajmer House.

Abhijeet Chaudhary was sworn in as the College Academics Captain. Vasav Gupta was appointed as the Ajmer House Captain and Avyaya Dalmia as the House Prefect. Bhagyaditya Singh Chundawat was appointed as the College Polo Captain.

In Sports Competitions, Ajmer House won six Inter House titles. In Hockey, Ajmer House brought both Senior and Middles titles, with Vinayak and Dushyant being adjudged the best players. Raghav, Dushyant, Vinayak, Giriraj, Aditya Pratap and Suryaveer are vital members of the the Mayo Hockey Team and have played various tournaments like the Nehru-Cup Hockey Tournament; the Old Boys Association sponsored the United for Hockey Tournament, where Mayo College was adjudged the winner. Giriraj was the Best Goalkeeper, Vinayak was the Best Defender and Dushyant yet again bagged the Best Player award. The young riders of the house, Jai Sud, Harsh Pal, Surya Pratap Singh Brar, Maldev Chouhan and Armaan were medalists across various horse shows in Jaipur, Delhi and Chinkara. Bhagyaditya Singh and Aditya Pratap participated in the Maj Sardar Singh Jasol Memorial Cup in Jodhpur Polo Season, where the team stood champions and lifted the Cup. Bhagyaditya Singh and Aditya Pratap, along with Vishwaraj Singh played the Junior Indian Polo Association Tournament. The house won the Inter House Football tournament. Shrey was adjudged the Player of the Tournament. Pranaav was declared the Player of the Tournament for Middles and Dushyant was the highest scorer. Pranaav and Fateh were the members of Under-17 Districts winning team in Football and got selected for the States. Shrey, Aromal and Pranaav were the members of IPSC U-U-19 winning team. Shrey was also adjudged the Best Player of the Mayo Football Tournament. Madhav Bahety won medals in the IPSC Squash Meet and participated in Squash Nationals along with Ronitt, Deveshwar and Amey. With efforts of Anugraha, Aromal, Jatin, Yash and Giriraj, Ajmer House emerged as the runner-up in the Inter House Gymnastics.

Pranaav Agarwala secured the 1st position in the Inter House Cross Country for Middles. In Athletics, sincere efforts by the boys led the house to win both the Middles and Seniors titles. Pranaav set a new record in 1,500m race and was adjudged as the Individual Group Champion. Dushyant set two new records in Discuss Throw and High Jump. Both represented the school in IPSC Athletics. Dushyant also participated in Athletics Nationals. In Rifle Shooting, Devansh, Akul and Heervijay were medalists of IPSC and also participated in the States and Pre Nationals. In Swimming, the Seniors team comprising Madhav, Aryan, Vinayak and Siddhant was declared the winners of the meet. Udairaj was the medalist of the District and States swimming competitions. In Cricket, a close fight in the finals with Jodhpur House, led the middles' team to stand runner-up of Inter House with Vasu Sachdeva being judged as the Best Batsman of the Meet. Raghuraj and Vasu were the members of the School IPSC Cricket team. In Tennis, Kinshuk and Jasraj were members of the District runner-up team. Simarpal was





the Bronze medalist of the IPSC Boxing Tournament. In Archery, Sidhant and Vijay were the medalists in the Districts and were selected for SGFI Nationals. In Table-Tennis, Shreyas, Yash Keshan and Abhay Totuka were the members of the District Winning Team. They also participated in TT States, IPSC and CBSE tournaments. Shreyas was the runner-up of the Mayo Chess Championship. In Mr Mayo & Mr Strongman, Aromal was adjudged the winner. In the field of Cultural activities, Ajmer House staged a one-act play called, Karma Konnection that was appreciated by all. Madhav Bahety participated in the first edition of the Indian National School Debate Championship. He was also adjudged the Best Speaker in the Inter House English Debates. Aryan Jaglan was the winner of the Spot Painting Competition during the Annual Flower Show. In Social Service activities, the following boys' contribution was commendable: Vasu, Aditya, Deveshwar, Raghav, Humayun, Jasraj and Madhav. The hard work and achievements of the boys were appreciated by the school and the sportsmen of the house were awarded with a staggering 22 colours across various and several College Sports Scholarships. Abhijeet Chaudhary was awarded the College Cravats for Academics. During the Prize Giving Ceremony 2017, Ajmer House lifted the Malsisar Cup for Inter House Football (Middles), Inter House Hockey Cup (Middles), Maj Gen KVS Lalotra Challenge Shield for Overall Champion in Middles Games.
