The special medal for securing a 10 CGPA in the Board Examination was awarded to Vibhav Agrawal and Shashwat Thakur. In the Prize Giving ceremony, some boys received special awards. Vibhav Agrawal bagged the prestigious Mayo College General Council Scholarship for Excellence in Academics, wherein 50% of the fees has been exempted and Gaj Singh Jaswal by bagging the K.C. Khanna Medal for the Best Extempore Speaker in Hindi Debates, special medal for Excellence in Model United Nations, Debating, and the special scholarship for Excellence in Debating. Shivam Mehra, Vibhav Agrawal, Abhinav Gupta and Samridh Rela, also received the Mayo College Scholarship for academics.

On the sports front, Kashmir House secured the 3rd position in the Seniors Inter House Hockey Tournament and also secured the 2nd position in Inter House Athletics Meet. Kashmir House again showed a collective effort by securing the 3rd position in Inter House Yoga. Tejas Singh has been an exceptional athlete, bringing laurels to the school and has made everyone proud of his achievements that include Districts Athletics Champion, States Athletics Champion, Nationals participation and Under-14 Champion in IPSC Athletics meet. Baljinder Singh was a part of the Hockey team that participated in the Nehru Cup. Daksh Bishnoi, Agrim Mittal, Siddhant Uphadhyay, Kavya Kakrania and Drona Sharma participated in the Squash Open Nationals Tournament held at Mayo College. Abhviraj Singh won the team Gold Medal in Shooting IPSC and the team that attended the IPSC was declared the overall champion in the Under-14 category. Chetan Singh received a Bronze Medal in Yoga at the State level and a Silver Medal in IPSC Yoga Competition. Vishnu Anand won a Gold and a Silver Medal in IPSC Yoga competition and another Gold in Yoga



state championship. Garv Vohra bagged a Gold Medal in Yoga Districts. Abhinav Gupta bagged five Golds in Swimming Open Districts, four Golds in Swimming Districts, One Silver Medal in Swimming State Championships and was selected for the National Championship. Aryaman Sharma was part of the Under-19 Football Team that won the IPSC Championship for the first time. Janmay Jay Singh Krishnawat was the captain of the Under-19 Hockey Team for the inaugural United for Hockey Tournament, where Mayo stood winners. He also led the Mayo Team to the Districts Tournament and stood first. He was also declared the Player of the Tournament and had represented Ajmer at the State Level.

The following boys were awarded the College Colours for their exceptional performance in sports this year: Janmay Jay Singh Krishnawat (Hockey), Amogh Rohmetra (Basketball), Samridh Rela (Football), Abhinav Gupta (Swimming), Vishnu Anand (Yoga), Aabhas Soni (Cross-country, Karate, Archery), Tejas Singh (Athletics), Chetan Singh (Yoga).

On the cultural front, Jaedan Sangma won the best actor award in the MCGS Silver Jubilee Dramatics Competition as well as in the Inter House Dramatics Competition. Yashovarman Singh stood 3rd in the MCGS Silver Jubilee Quiz Competition. Gaj Singh won four Best Speaker awards in the JTM Gibson Memorial Debates and led the Mayo team to the



semi-finals round. Kanak Arora was an indispensable part of the Mayo Film-making Society and made a lot of videos for the school, including those made on Green Mayo, MFT and the making of PG play 2017. Garv Vohra won the 1st prize in LCF Movie making and 2nd prize in individual French Reading. Uttkarsh Agarwal stood 1st in Pracheen Kala Kendra Vocal Exam, 2017. Garv Vohra, Shivam Mehra, Uttkarsh Agarwal and Samarth Jadeja were selected to represent Mayo College at the Round Square International Conference, 2017 held in Cape Town.
